

Welcome to LA HAP! A Guide for Uninsured Members

What is the Louisiana Health Access Program?

The Louisiana Health Access Program (LA HAP) is a program for both insured and uninsured individuals. If you have insurance, LA HAP can pay premiums, copays and deductibles for you. If you do NOT have insurance, LA HAP can pay the cost of medications for you which are on the LA HAP formulary. LA HAP is run by the Office of Public Health in New Orleans.

How to read your LA HAP card

Your card lets you know what services LA HAP covers for you, and the date by which you need to recertify your benefits. LA HAP requires members to recertify every 12 months. The card also contains codes that the pharmacy needs to process your medication claims.

On the back of your card, you will find all the numbers you will need for any problem you might have using your card and the address where claims can be sent.

If you lose your card, you can call LA HAP at 504-568-7474 to request a replacement. You should still be able to get your medications and go to the doctor if your current information is on file with your pharmacist and doctor.

Want to manage your LA HAP benefits online? Access the LA HAP Member Portal at www.lahapenroll.com. On the Portal, you can submit applications, upload documents, and send secure messages to LA HAP staff.

How do I use my LA HAP benefits?

LA HAP can pay for your medications which are on the LA HAP formulary. You can find this formulary online at www.lahap.org/using-your-benefits or you can call LA HAP at 504-568-7474 to check what is covered.

Visiting the pharmacy: You can visit any pharmacy in the LA HAP Uninsured Pharmacy Network which is listed below. Some of these pharmacies are also mail-order pharmacies and can send medication to your home or another address that you choose, even if that you live in a different city.

Show your pharmacist your prescription and your LA HAP card, which they will use to bill LA HAP for your medications. You shouldn't have any bills for medications on the formulary.
